

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is conducting a public hearing regarding the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study to provide interested persons the opportunity to review the analysis findings and to receive input on the Recommended Alternative and safety improvements.

The project extends from Portside Drive in Santa Rosa County to Mary Esther Boulevard in Okaloosa County, 24.5 miles. This study is evaluating roadway safety, access management features, the efficiency of intersection operations, and bicycle and pedestrian facilities along the corridor. Access management changes along U.S. 98 include modifying, closing, and creating new median openings. The project includes an evaluation of environmental impacts and anticipated *de minimis* finding (minimal impact) under Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of Transportation Act. The hearing will begin in an open house format at 5:30 p.m. CST, with a formal presentation at 6:30 p.m., followed by a public comment period.

The study has investigated the following:

- Widening the existing facility throughout the project limits.
- Improving the efficiency of intersection operations.
- Improving safety with access management features.
- Providing interchanges at S.R. 87 and S.R. 399.
- Providing sidewalk and bicycle enhancements.

The intent of this study is to identify alternatives and evaluate the potential environmental, engineering and social impacts. The study also assesses access management modifications, intersection operation efficiency, pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements, and potential interchanges on U. S. 98 at S.R. 87 and S.R. 399. The results of the study will provide FDOT the information necessary to make a decision on the conceptual design of the roadway widening project.

On September 20 & 22, 2016 a Kickoff meeting was held to introduce the study area and receive public input. The feedback received from the public helped the study team to develop roadway widening alternatives and potential intersection improvements.

On October 24 & 26, 2017 an Alternatives meeting was held to present alternatives for the roadway widening between Portside Drive and Mary Esther, the Navarre area, and the City of Mary Esther. Attendees were able to review the alternatives, ask questions, and offer comments.

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by FDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. § 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated December 14, 2016, and executed by FHWA and FDOT.

Recommended Alternatives

The PD&E Study has evaluated a number of "Build" and "No-Build" alternatives. Based on the engineering, economic, social, cultural, and environmental aspects, as well as public input received throughout the study, Recommended Alternatives have been identified for Portside Drive to the Mary Esther City Limits, the Navarre area, and the City of Mary Esther.

Portside Drive to Mary Esther City Limits

This Recommended Alternative utilizes a standard urban typical section with a design speed of 45 miles per hour (mph) that generally follows the existing U.S. 98 alignment. At the S.R. 87 and S.R. 399 overpass locations, local traffic will be accommodated with a signalized intersection at S.R. 87 and a non-signalized roundabout at S.R. 399,

City of Mary Esther

The Recommended Alternative is the 126-foot typical section on a best fit alignment with a design speed of 45 mph. This alternative has substantially less right-of-way impacts, fewer social impacts, and less right-of-way cost. This Alternative impacts Oak Tree Nature Park and a *de minimis* finding (minimal impact) is being pursued.



Navarre Area



- · 6-foot sidewalk






Project Schedule
